



Guardian Angels Targeting "Bad Guys" in Cyber-Space

The Guardian Angels crime-fighting group says it is ready to teach your children and your children's teachers how to avoid bad guys in cyber-space.

New York is giving the red-bereted Angels 200-thousand dollars to hold workshops and seminars in schools around the state to show kids how to avoid online predators.

And the founder of the Angels, Curtis Sliwa, tells NEWS10's John McLoughlin, over the phone from New York City Monday, that it is just as important to teach the teachers.

"The kids are far more savvy and far more aware of how to avoid all of the potentials to safeguard them, so we teach them the tricks of the trade," says Sliwa.

Sliwa, by the way, will be arriving in Gloversville Monday night, where he is supposed to induct nine new members into the Capital Region's Guardian Angels.
