

Curtis Sliwa is selected as the Daily Point of Light for Friday, August 23, 2002



For over 20 years, this founder of the Guardian Angels Safety Patrol has spearheaded volunteer efforts to make a difference in his community and the nation. From guarding the inner-city New York subways to creating on-line and after-school programs for troubled and displaced teens, Sliwa's vision and compelling drive has had an impact on the lives of millions people.

“For all volunteers, this award is the equivalent to when an actor or an actress wins an Oscar. For a journalist, it is the Pulitzer Prize. It's the one time when a volunteer can get recognition from their peers for selfless service,” said Sliwa,

Sliwa's many selfless deeds, from the life-saving rescue of six neighbors from a burning building, to the creation of one of the nation's first recycling centers--of which the proceeds were donated to a neighborhood children's group, have earned him many honors. Curtis has been recognized by Presidents Nixon, Reagan and Clinton, applauded repeatedly by former New York Mayor Rudolph Giuliani, and honored by business, entertainment and civic leaders.

“We receive nominations, highlighting various volunteer activities and initiatives, daily. We search for programs that meet community needs and lead to long-term solutions; efforts that build connections between the community, are at least six months in duration and demonstrate measurable impact,” said Robert K. Goodwin, President and CEO of the Points of Light Foundation & Volunteer Center National Network. “For demonstrating volunteer service that meets all of these criteria, Curtis Sliwa is truly deserving of recognition as a Daily Point of Light.”
