New Orleans - Signs are all over Algiers Point featuring a composite sketch that is a description of the man wanted in the killing of 44-year-old Mike Ainsworth. Ainsworth was killed Wednesday morning. He was shot while trying to stop a carjacking.

Steve Dikes just returned home to the Point. He was gone when the shooting happened. "It kind of reminds me of the old west," says Dikes. "Outside the sheriff's office would be wanted posters. We're back to that time again."

You might say there's also a posse in the streets of his neighborhood. The group includes concerned citizens, police and the Guardian Angels. The group joined the effort Friday.

Robert McClintick is not only the leader of the local chapter, he was also Mike Ainsworth's friend. "In a city where the criminals place no value on human life, there are a lot of good people who place value on human life and he was one of them," says McClintick.

The Guardian Angels rode their bikes through the neighborhood making their presence known and handing out flyers. They also worked to gather information from the community. McClintick says sometimes people feel more comfortable sharing information with them. Any information they get goes straight to the investigating detectives.

Dikes says seeing the Guardian Angels in the neighborhood is comforting and disheartening at the same time. "Everybody says the same thing, 'I never thought it'd happen here', but it does unfortunately."
